Check Scholarship Chances, Urges Marygrove Head

More than two-thirds of the total student body at Marygrove College received financial aid amounting to almost \$415,000 during the 1970-71 academic year, President Arthur W. Brown reports.

"It is a pity," Dr. Brown commended, "that, instead of realizing what a bargain education is today, so many students are impressed with what they believe to be the high cost that they do not even apply for admission. Or else they apply to less expensive colleges due to personal financial considerations without investigating the possibilities of financial aid."

"Only \$130,516 were in loans," Dr. Brown explained. "Marygrove service grants of \$40,000, Marygrove scholarships of \$40,000, plus other Marygrove monies totaled to a budget of \$120,000 as the college's contribution to the students' education."

"Thirty top scholars garnered room and board of \$11,667. Marygrove's contribution for the coming year is budgeted for \$134,000."

The rest of the year's financial aid package was supplemented by federal funds, such as economic opportunity grants, State tuition grants available only to students attending private colleges and State scholarships for quality students.

"Financial aid is a partnership between the college, the state, the parents, the students and the Federal government," Dr. Brown said. "Students may well prefer a small liberal arts coeducational college such as Marygrove, but are unaware that, if they are indeed admissible at the college level, they might well qualify for financial aid."
