## West Point Park PTA Holds Meeting

The state highway department began distribution this week of a special map for use during spring break-up. State Highway Commissioner Murray D. Van Wagoner said that although the map was intended primarily for truckers, it would be available for anyone desiring a copy.

The map will show only trunk highways and distinguish between the highways on a basis of road types. Roads having concrete surface or a concrete base will be designated by one color. Another color will show all other roads. The health of hard-surfaced roads and a third color will indicate gravel roads.

The commissioner explained that this basis for designating roads has been adopted to assist truckers while spring truck loading restrictions are in effect. The spring limit set by law require about a 25 per cent reduction in normal maximum loads on concrete and concrete base roads and a 35 per cent

## VARYING LICENSE PLATE DEADLINES CAUSE CONFUSION

Lack of uniformity of automobile license plates in the United States has resulted in general confusion, harassment and even false arrests of touring motorists. Richard Harst, general manager of the Automobile Club of Michigan, has been advised by A.A.A. national headquarters in Washington.

"License tags of the forty-eight states expire all the way from October to the following June," Harst said. "The table of dead dates sent out by the A.A.A. to state motor vehicle administrators shows that one state issues tags in October, one in November; eleven in December; seven in January; fourteen in February; nine in March; four in April; one in May, and one in June.

"Adding to the confusion is the practice of many states of granting last-minute time extensions. Motorists have a tendency to count on these extensions, and fail to make provisions for new tags while traveling in other states.

"The situation has become so involved that only the day-to-day activities of the A.A.A. in coordinating information on dead tag dates and forwarding it to motor clubs and motor vehicle administrators throughout the country prevent wholesale arrests of touring motorists.

A nominating committee was also appointed to prepare a list of candidates to be voted on as officers for the next year. It was decided to make the April meeting a week earlier than customary.

## CHANGES IN STATE DRIVERS' LAW SOUGHT BY BILL

House bill 269 recently introduced in the House of Representatives to amend two controversial sections of the state drivers' law, one, the diversion of money raised under the law, second, the loop hole through which apathetic examinations are given to applicants, has been endorsed by the Automobile Club of Michigan through Charles L. Weeks, president.

Under the provisions of the bill introduced by Rep. John F. Kessel, Saginaw, and Rep. Alexander M. Mackay, West Branch, license money will be appropriated from the general fund to increase an increased highway safety, to assist in the high accident increase, and the enforcement of the present drivers' examination section.

The Detroit office and 26 branches will attempt to impress upon the general public the necessity of changing the present law. Legislators have been stirred to action because of the continued increase in Michigan traffic fatalities which showed an increase of 224 deaths in 1936 over 1935. A total of 1,883 persons were killed in automobile accidents last year.


