# COUNTY SHARES STATE HIGHWAY REVENUES

The records of the state Highway Department reveal that as of March 1, it has returned \$3,146,748.20 of state highway revenues to Oakland County since the end of fiscal year 1933.

This return of funds has enabled the county to maintain and improve its own highway system including the former (ownship roads, and in addition, to reduce the same time property taxes of highway purposes have been reduced almost to the vanishing point.


