

NRS OFFICES NOW REGISTERING FOR FARM PLACEMENTS

With the advent of spring activities in agricultural areas the National Reemployment Service will again aid farmers to secure qualified workers in Michigan, according to Major Howard Starret, State Reemployment Director.

"During the past year the NRS has successfully placed thousands of experienced farm hands on hundreds of Michigan farms," he said. "This spring, our 43 offices are anticipating finding jobs for many qualified agricultural workers of all kinds."

Among the numerous farm labor classifications used by the NRS are plowmen, best field workers, milkers, tractor operators, farm

housekeepers, poultrymen, farm managers and dozens of others. Experienced farm hands are urged to register with the NRS offices serving the county in which they reside.

Farmers needing men or women for agricultural activities may apply for help through their local branch office. For further information regarding the location of NRS offices throughout the state, farmers may write to Major Howard Starret, State Director, at 1702 Washington Boulevard Building in Detroit. There is no charge for this service to either farmers or farm workers.

Quick Auto Record Check Now Offered

In order to cooperate fully with all police officers seeking hit and run drivers, bandits, kidnapers, or criminals of any kind, Leon D. Case, Secretary of State, has inaugurated 24 hour service during which records of this department will be available.

Complete state files of all license numbers, operators' licenses, motor and serial numbers, reports of cars stolen or abandoned, will be available to police officials and others concerned, at any hour of the day or night, as the result of the extended service. All police officials, including sheriff's offices, state police and all peace officers, will have ready an immediate emergency access to these records by telephone from any part of the state.

Two years ago this service was available, at the request of the Michigan State Police, until 1:00 o'clock each morning. Results have been so satisfactory and worthwhile, that the complete "around the clock" service has been decided upon by Case.

Dondero Bill Seeks Lower Milk Bottle Cost

H. R. 4397, a bill to exempt from duty certain milk bottles returned to the United States, introduced by Congressman George A. Dondero, 17th Michigan District, is now before the House Committee on Ways and Means for consideration.

At the present time it is conservatively estimated that 200,000 milk bottles owned by the dairy companies of Michigan are annually taken into Canada by individual buyers, of milk.

Under the provisions of the Tariff Act of 1930, the duty on the return of such bottles to the United States for distribution to the dairy companies owning them is pro-

hibitive, it now costs nearly as much to return a used bottle to the United States as it does to buy a new one from a manufacturer. The spread between the two costs is not sufficient to justify recovery.
