

War of Postal Systems, a Most Curious Episode
The entry of the Low countries into the Holy Roman empire in the sixteenth century brought on one of the most curious episodes in the history of mail, a war between the local carriers supported by the townspeople and the Imperial post which had come in with the Spanish army. The writer in the New York Herald-Tribune. The industrial cities of the Netherlands and at this time the richest in Europe and over the centuries had obtained a large measure of self-government which included the operation of a primitive courier system to serve the needs of the merchants and guilds. The postmen were appointed by the magistrates and operated over individual routes for their own profit. These routes, which were traveled on foot, horseback or by boat, connected all of the towns of the Netherlands and extended to the industrial centers of England, France and Germany. The mails carried were considerable and the Imperial post immediately set out to obtain the business, but this the townspeople stoutly resisted. The carriers were their concessionaires and they would not see their interference with. When requests to have the Imperial post established failed, the townspeople took things into their own hands and attempted to forcibly oust it. The Imperial postmen were seized and their mail turned over to the local carrier, and the government officials tried to break up the local posts, they were set upon and beaten by the mobs. This curious little "war" at times reached sizable proportions. Troops had to be called to quell the riots and after one severe outbreak in Antwerp five of the rioters were hanged. The end of this postal war came only when the complete independence of the Netherlands.

Leyden, Land of Liberty, Is Linked to Plymouth
Holland never erected a Statue of Liberty at the entrance to its principal city, noted for its tower in the Boston Globe, but long before the American "Land of the free and home of the brave" became important on the map, Holland was the European "Land of Liberty." Here John Robinson kept the light of religious liberty burning and induced his parish of "Pilgrim Fathers" to embark on the Mayflower in 1620.
Here is the "High School" started by William, Prince of Orange, in 1575, which in a few years became the most famous university in Europe. Michau in his own history says that "no locality in Europe is so memorable in the history of science as its venerable halls."
When the English and French were persecuted in their own lands, Leyden, their refuge. Leyden is the only place on earth that ever refused to be exempt from taxation.
When its prince in 1574 wanted to reward the inhabitants for their gallant conduct in a siege, he offered exemption from taxation or a university. They chose a university.

The Coney Is a Strange One
The hyrax, or coney, an animal about the size of the rabbit, is rodent-like in general appearance, having long front teeth and pointed muzzle. However, he does not have the usual five toes and strong claws of the other members of the gnawing family and anatomically resembles more closely the elephant and rhinoceros than any other species living, says Nature Magazine of Washington. The toenails are short and rounded like those of the huge pachyderms. The large front teeth at first glance resembling the strong gnawing teeth of the squirrel, are not flat and chisel-shaped, but instead are three-sided and pointed like the fangs of the great cats. The upper teeth grow throughout the animal's life as do elephants' tusks. In structure, the seven cheek teeth of both jaws resemble those of the rhinoceros and its extinct relative, the palaeotherium.

Antigua, Guatemala
Antigua, Guatemala, is a city of ruins. It is a dead city, a city of memories, a thing of the past. There are many homes there and shops and a certain amount of buying and selling. Used Fans, Fancy Kerchiefs

CHARLES LOUIS NAPOLEON BONAPARTE wanted to be emperor of France, as his uncle, Napoleon Bonaparte, had been. The revolution of 1848 gave him his first chance for it. He was elected to the national assembly. Next he secured the office of president. But Louis Napoleon wasn't satisfied with this. He wanted his term of office extended to ten years and a residence in the Tuilleries. Then on December 2, 1851, he staged his famous coup d'etat. (Massacre them all!) ran outside to give the order to the troops.
