An Armistead?

THERE is a tradition that the name Armistead originated in Darmstadt, Germany, and that members of the family crossed the sea with the Norsemen and settled in England. But this is still only tradition and what is really known as the first home of the family is Yorkshire, England. It was there that Anthony Armistead and his wife, Frances Thompson, lived. They were the parents of William, the founder of the Armistead family in America.

William Armistead settled in Gloucester county, Virginia, where he was a vestryman of Gloucester parish in 1077. He was the father of John Armistead, who was an

important figure in the colonial history of Virginia. In 1075 he was high sheriff of Gloucester county, a member of the house of Burgesses, 1083, and in 1087 was appointed a member of the Colonial council.

After the accession of William and Mary to the throne of England, John Armistead, Isaac Armistead and Richard Lee, three distinguished counselors, were dismissed from office for their refusal to take oath of allegiance to the new sovereigns. The staunch loyalty of Armistead to the cause of the colonists and his capacity for leadership brought about his appointment as lieutenant colonel of Gloucester county, Virginia, forces in the Revolution.

Tremendous Trifles

DIXIE

BACK in the early days of the republic when a host of steamboats plied the Mississippi, the boatman, when in New Orleans, did most of their banking at the Banque des Citoyens. It issued bank notes printed in English on one side and in French on the other.

Its ten-dollar note bore the word "DIXE" (ten) printed in large letters. So the boatman spoke of it colloquially as a "dix," and New Orleans became the town where they got the "dixers" or "dixies," they carried the word north and soon the entire South came to be known as the "dixie country."

Then in 1859, Daniel D. Emmett wrote a song about "de land ob cotton—Dixieland." It was first sung by Bryant's minstrels at Mechanics' hall in New York city, but the South, the real "Dixieland," immediately took it up as its own.

Two years later, to its rollicking strains, men in gray rode forth to "fire and die for Dixie." It helped inspire them to such feats of valor as the world had never seen before and it buoyed them up in those dark days when the "Lost Cause" was slowly but surely being borne down by the North's superior numbers.

Today that tune still has the power to thrill the hearts of a reunited nation as no other tune has—this song which takes its name from the Mississippi steamboat men's familiar term for a piece of money printed in two languages!

The Ringnecked Dove

The Ringnecked or Barbary dove has been in this country for so many years that their origin is nearly forgotten but they were first brought to England by traders from the northern coast of Africa about 1000. Named after the region in which they were discovered, it is a presumption that perhaps this species of dove is an exact duplicate of the one that Noah sent out from the ark to see if the "waters were abated from off the earth."

Reduced Number of Indians

The prehistoric Indian population of northern Arizona was destroyed by "tenement" conditions nearly 1,000 years ago, a director of the Museum of Northern Arizona declares. Tracing the habits of the Indian population, he said that from the time they moved from single-family pit houses to multi-family apartment houses, or pueblos, similar to modern tenements, the population of the tribes dropped from 23,000 to 2,000.

Brilliant Calliopsis Is Easily Grown

One of the gayest flowers to be found in any garden, and one hardy enough for almost any climate, is the calliopsis. Formerly known as coreopsis, the true name for the petunia origin. It has recently been developed to new heights as an annual, and is known for its wavy stemmed blooms brilliantly colored in yellow and maroon and crimson. For table bouquets it is unsurpassed.

The rich red types are most effective for garden decorative purposes, but they need the lightening touch of the yellow trim to set them off properly. Most of the varieties have this trimming, differing in widths and intensity, with a maroon, scarlet or crimson at the periphery as an edging. A nice arrangement is to have the tall varieties in the center of a bed, with the dwarf types on the perimeter as an edging.

Calliopsis may be planted early or late, and because of their rapidity of growth, they are particularly suitable for the late planting when some other flower has failed. Soil conditions do not matter so much; they demand plenty of sun. Plant them where they are to grow, as transplanting is not always satisfactory and when they have made a fair growth, thin them out to 12 inches apart for the tall varieties, and from 6 to 8 inches for the dwarfs. When midsummer comes, the blooms will form a solid mass, covering the foliage almost completely.

Lives Without Eating

An animal which can live for years without eating is on exhibit at the Field Museum of Natural History, Chicago. It is the olm, one of the three known species of cave salamanders. Found only in the deep, lightless caves of Europe, the creature has a snake-like body about a foot long. Its four legs are set widely apart and are almost useless. This doesn't bother the olm, for it is one of the most sluggish animals known, spending most of its time lying motionless on a rocky ledge, or among the stones at the bottom of a stream. With the exception of its gills, which are red, the olm is perfectly white, but it exposed to the sun will turn jet black. The eyes, since it does not need them, have degenerated and are completely hidden under the skin.

The Carolina Banks

The Carolina banks begin just south of Cape Henry in Virginia and run south for 120 miles. At no point are they more than three miles wide and in some places narrow down to half a mile. Back of them lie the Albemarle and Pamlico sounds, emptying into the Atlantic through rivers that change their position with the years. On their sandy wastes little vegetation grows, although here and there on the sound side of the banks are clumps of twisted trees, misshapen by the constant battering they receive from the gales.
