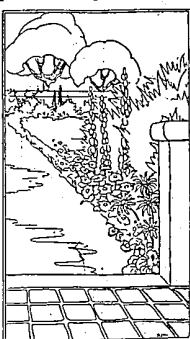

## Annuals Fill Every Garden Need

Annual flowers which grow to maturity, produce blossoms, seed and die in one season, have rapidly improved in recent years. Owing to their varying habits and wide range of uses they are suitable for almost every conceivable position in the garden, for filling

spaces vacated by early bulbs in the border, for edgings, for solid beds, for rockeries, many of them for greenhouse plants, and others for shady situations and still others for the hottest and driest of situations. Front yard plantings of annuals are being advocated this year in an effort to make our homes appear as colorful from the street as they are in the garden behind the house.

Annuals alone can completely furnish a garden giving a sheet of bloom, that cannot be attained by the use of perennials alone for a long period. They are the sole dependence for great masses of color during the latter half of the summer. Their possibilities have not been thoroughly realized because they have not received the care and attention necessary to their best development, largely from the fact that they grow so easily that the seed is generally sown much too thickly and the annuals are left to struggle along and despite this handicap give a good account of themselves.

**Shares Its Nesting Places**  
The white-faced glossy ibis is the only true ibis that occurs in any considerable numbers in North America. It still breeds in favorable places from middle Mexico north to Oregon, Nevada and Utah, says Nature Magazine. In the Bear river marshes, one of its principal nesting sites, it shares with the snowy egret and other herons the tule marshes. The nests are roughly built on the matted beds of tule. The food of both adult and young consists of crawfish, snails, water insects, fishes, and frogs.

**Peppy's Tea Secret**

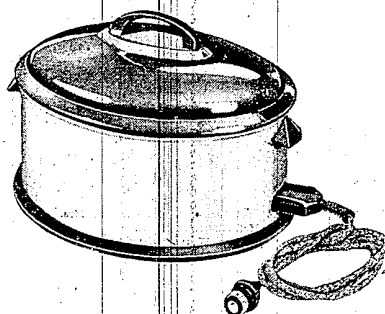

## A Holcombe?

THERE is a very ancient English family which probably took its name from the old town in Lancashire called "Holcombe." The family seat, however, was in County Devon, and old records of Devonshire mention many of this name. We note the names of Thomas, Elizabeth and three Johns.

The most remote ancestor of the Holcombes, through marriage, was William the Conqueror. John Holcombe is the first mentioned in the Visitations of England. He was a Crusader and the story is that he severed the heads of three Moham-



medans with one stroke of his sword. This explains the four heads on the coat of arms shown. The effigy of this brave knight rests in the old abbey at Dorchester, near Oxford, England.

Thomas Holcombe, one of the first Americans of the name, was born in Devonshire in 1601. In 1630 he came to America on the famous ship Mary and John, and settled in Dorchester, Mass., which is now a part of Boston. Dorchester was so named in honor of the well-loved English town.

Most of the Holcombes of the New England states trace their ancestry to Thomas, as do some families in other states.

Then there was John Holcombe, a Quaker, who emigrated from England in 1700, and settled in Philadelphia, and also his brother Jacob, who located in Lambertville, N. J.

The southern branch of the Holcombes in this country began with Andrew, of Devonshire, England, who came first to the Barbadoes and then to Virginia. His son, John, married Miss Grimes and lived in King William county, Virginia.

The Holcombes in America have been people of high social standing and prominence in every generation. The motto "truth and courage" is characteristic of the family traits and traditions.
