The gasoline tax law provides that users of gasoline for other than highway purposes are entitled to gas tax refunds, on written applications by the users themselves after the fuel has been consumed. Applications must be accompanied by copies of invoices; refunds, when allowed, are sent directly to the retailers for distribution to the consumers entitled to them.
