League Head and Umpire Mobbed

Attempted mobbing of president-bumpire Earl G. Gray, president of the Inter-County League, of which Farmington is a member, by a large portion of the 150 spectators added an exciting climax to a closely contested baseball game between the Belleville and Garden City teams last Sunday.

As soon as the last man was out, the mob surged over the Garden City diamond, surrounded Gray, knocked him to the ground and threatened bodily harm as the result of two decisions he made during the game. Chief of Police Art Nagle succeeded in getting Gray off the field unharmed.

Both decisions which aroused the anger of the spectators occurred at home plate; one when Bud Johnson, Garden City left-fielder, came home on a hit by Tom and the other when Charles Wolfgram, Garden City center-fielder, tried for home on a double steal. Both men were called out at home plate by Gray.

Several of those who witnessed the plays affirmed that they were not even close, that both men undoubtedly were safe. Evidently there were enough spectators with thoughts running in a life channel to cause an uncomfortable three or four minutes for Mr. Gray.

The game was a close one to the very last. Belleville pushed over two runs in the fourth to take the lead, 2 to 0. Garden City following closely with one run in each of the fifth and sixth innings leaving
