## Liquor Sales By Glass Issue Rises

5 Cents a Copy

Whether sale of liquor by the slass shall be permitted is a question again at issue in Farmington, along with all other communities in the State. The matter is at issue to a greater extent in the City of Farmington than in Farmington Township, the Township Board having voted only recently in favor left the sale. However, it is possible that due to a technicality, the Township Board may have to yote again, though the prior unanimous vote would appear to indicate what the outcome would be in that event. Circulation of petitions has entered the situation in Farmington City, the petitions requesting the governing body to take no action, until there has been a vote of the people. In this, as in all other communities of the State, Junder the new law, the governing body must act before September 21, or determination of the question automatically passes from their jurisdiction. This is true despite the fact that the governing body has once voted to approve the sales are now permitted.
