The "10 and 10 plan", says Mr. Gundry, helps those propertyowners who cannot pay in full at this time, by permitting the payment of 10 per cent of taxes due up to and including 1935, and allows the balance to be paid on a 10 year plan. It is decidedly to the advantage of taxpayers to use this plan. Interest and penalties have been cancelled and the only added charge is a 2% collection fee on the amount paid. amount paid.

In order to take advantage of the provisions of the law it is necessary that 1936 taxes be paid in full. County Treasurers are fully acquainted with the Act and are already receiving applications from many tax-payers who wellower this method of discharging their properties from the certainty of tax saile next May. It is very important, however, that arrangements be made before September 1st, after which no further relief can be granted. can be granted.


LOWELL THOMAS WAS A COOK
