NRS Issues Warning Against Cashing Checks:

Merchants and others who might be likely to cash checks were warned today by Major Howard Starret, State Re-employment Director, not to accept National Re-employment Service registration cards as positive proof of the person's identity.

This week a Detroit woman was arrested on a charge of stealing, forging and cashing a government check and using as her identification a NRS registration card, bearing the name of the person to whom the check was issued.

"This is the first time that such a situation has come to our attention," Major Starret said. "However, we do know that NRS registration cards are easily recognized by merchants and others who might be in a position to accept them as proof of the bearer's identification. Should these cards fall into the hands of criminally inclined persons there is nothing to prevent them from passing themselves off as the person to whom the card was originally issued.

Registration cards have been issued to almost 800,000 persons who have used our offices in Michigan since the NRS opened," Starret pointed out. "This is a formal-ity to quickly identify the bearer and to help us locate his record in our files. Naturally hundreds of these cards have been lost and may have fallen into the hands of unscrupulous persons.

Detroit Federal Theatre To Present Stage Show

The Detroit Federal Theatre will present a one-night performance of "The Tragical History of Doctor Faustus" in a specially constructed theatre at the State Fair, on the evening of September 10. The great sixteenth century classic, written by Christopher Marlowe and dealing with the struggles of the soul of the German philosopher Faustus, with the powers of good and evil, was produced for the first time in Detroit last season at the People's Theatre, 8212 Twelfth street, by the local Federal Theatre. The famous morality play was shown at the Belle Isle Shell August 16 to 22, the outdoor presentation attracting audiences of 3000 nightly.

Verner Haldene will direct the attraction at the State Fair and the sets and costumes designed by Stephen Nastfogel for the original Detroit production of "Faustus" will be used. Lighting and sound equipment will be under the direction of Jacques LaPere, technical director of the Detroit Federal Theatre.
