What lines of work are abnorbing unemployed men and women today?

The answers are apparent in a survey of a cross-section of 3.526 placements made during a recent month comprising 2.596 men and 1.039 women, made by the National Re-employment Service in Michigan, and revealed this week by Major Howard Starret, stated director.

Jobs as craftsmen, or skilled workers, were given to \$92, chiefly men, Starret said. The biggest sources of jobs during this month were carpentry, brickhying, diemaking, medhilist work, auto mechanics and painting and decorating. Semi-skilled production jobs went to \$177, many women qualifying for these. In this group, predominately machine workers, such submitted the predominately machine workers, such on, were given 199 of the jobs while \$78 predominately manual jobs went to such workers as jassemblers, rough carpenters, inspectors, and finishers, stevedores and others.

Physical labor gave jobs to 586, or 16 per cent of the survey. Of these, 388 went to heavy labor jobs, such as ditch diggers, construction work, freight loading and machinery packing; 198 went to light labor work including bench girls, factory labor, general warehouse work and similar types. Seventy-six youths without any experience, but with abilities along certain lines, were placed as apprentices on all kinds of jobs from opticians to upholaterers. Included
