Lutheran Church to Conduct Broadcast Series
According to an announcement made this week by Rev. Graupner, pastor of the St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Farmington, a new series of 25 Lutheran Hour broadcasts, featuring the noted theologian, Dr. Walter A. Maier, Ph. D., will begin next Sunday (October 24), over a coast-to-coast network of the Mutual Broadcasting system.

With 46 stations participating, the network will be the largest to carry the broadcasts, since the Lutheran Hour originated in 1931. With 28 stations on the network last fall, more than 50,000 letters were received from the listening audience, and the present expansion is the result, according to the Lutheran Laymen's League, of the enthusiastic reception of the programs.
