First Phone Call From New York to Chicago Occurred Just 45 Years Ago



Scated in the foreground is Alexander Graham Bell, who in 1876 invented the telephone. Directly behind him stand the President and Vice President of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company. The data is October 18, 1892, the occasion is the formal opening of telephone service between New York and Ohicago—a great advance in the extension of long distance service, accomplished by the construction of a direct circuit with copper wires nearly as large as a slate pencil and containing more than 400 tons of copper.

The first telephone conversation between New York and Chicago took place only 45 years ago. Ceremoules inaugurating the service, over the first direct circuit ever constructed inaugurating the service, over the first direct circuit ever constructed for so great a distance, took place on October 18, 1892. Principal figure among the notables at the gathering was Alexander Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone, who only 16 years before had spoken the first sentence ever transmitted by wire. Extension of voice communication from the East to Chicago was an important event. Newspaper editors, public officials, and other notables had been fuvited, and a special announcement had been prepared.
