**Poet Byron Was an Ardent Patron of Prize Fighting**

Byron's interest in boxing is well-known. As some one once said of him, he "viewed boxing as a national propensity, and a stimulus to true courage." In the latter part of the Eighteenth century, John Jackson—"Gentleman" Jackson—to the crowd—was champion of England. Byron was one of his pupils. The poet, once rebuked for keeping company with a pugilist, insisted that Jackson's manners were infinitely superior to those of some of the fellows at the high table of the college he attended. The manly art of self defense had an even more august patron than Byron, however, for George IV, when prince regent, was very fond of boxing.

There is a story that he was once watching a bout between one of his court friends, Lord Barrymore, a noted amateur pugilist, and a certain tradesman, at Brighton. The prince observed an attempt by the courtier to take an unfair advantage of his adversary and he shouted out, "Damn it, Barrymore, fight like a man!" John Gully, England's heavyweight professional champion at the beginning of the Nineteenth century, became speaker of the house of commons, and won the Derby twice.
