Surface Height Faults Cause Tired Feeling

Aches and pains that make many jobs hard to complete in Michigan rural and city home often are caused by having working surfaces at incorrect heights: There can be as much as 10 inches difference in the average preferred height for such a job as cutting cloth and one for such work as can be done on a kitchen planning desk. Studies of working surfaces have been made by Irma H. Gross, professor in home management at Michigan State Col;

She finds that for rolling dought he average preferred height la 3.7. inches from the floor. For cut ing cloth the height which makes the work easiest to complete is 5.4. inches. For beating, 31.6 inches; for inding, 32.6 inches; and for the surface of a kitchen planning table, 25 inches.
