The Four Seasons The civil or tropical year, the one commonly used in the measure at time, is the period which elapses from the sun's appearance on one of the tropical circles to its return to the same. It varies very slightly, and has a mean length of 356 days 5 hours 48 minutes 49.7 seconds. Astronomically considered, the four seasons begin at the equinoctial through the point where the sun touches the Tropic of Cancer; the whiter solitice is the meridian pass.
