

Merchants Lose Opener; To Play Here Again Sunday

After warming up in a game with the Boys Club on the home diamond Saturday, the Farmington Merchants team will meet the Ace of Clubs in the second inter-league game of the season at 2:30 Sunday on the high school field. Saturday's game is scheduled for 2 p. m.

Inexperience cost the Merchants the opening game of the league season Sunday when they lost to the strong Inkster nine 4 to 0.

Immediately preceding the game players of both teams gathered about home plate and stood with bared heads in a moment of silent tribute to their mothers.

Mayor Howard Warner officially opened the league season in Farmington by pitching the first ball, a strike over the heart of the plate. He removed neither his hat nor his coat.

An interesting pitching duel took place between Pechette of Inkster and Gus Rosenboom of Farmington with Pechette getting better support and breaks. The Inkster hurler whiffed 11 men, allowing only six hits. Rosenboom struck out seven, but gave up 13 hits, several catching Merchant infielders out of position.

No Walks

A feature of the game was that neither pitcher issued a walk.

Morgan was one of the busiest men in the Inkster lineup, collecting three hits and two runs in four times at bat and committing two of the teams three errors. Freer, left fielder, made the third bobbie when he failed to hold Wereschin's fly. Wereschin made Farmington's only error, dropping Miasko's high fly in the sixth.

LaChance and Mennick scored the visitors' two other runs. LaChance, Freer, Coleman and Pechette hit twice and Mennick and Miasko got one each.

Cox, Himmelsbach, Wereschin, Shafer, Keller and Rosenboom hit safely for Farmington.

Brilliant Catch

The game was somewhat ragged with extremes of good and bad play. One of the best plays of the game was in the first inning when Tony Himmelsbach, Merchant centerfielder, made a brilliant catch of Thompson's long fly. Running far back and to the right, Himmelsbach stretched for the ball and held it in spite of a stumble.

Manager H. P. Brennan is not dissatisfied because of the loss. "The boys played good ball generally," he said. "They lost the breaks, but that can happen in any ball game. About two years is necessary to build a championship ball club from a green team, but they'll win plenty of ball games before the season is finished."

With meager support, Rosenboom got off to a bad start, but soon settled down to steady pitching. Only in the fourth inning did Inkster bunch hits to score. Mennick singled and Morgan doubled to start the inning, and with two out, LaChance lined a single to right, scoring both runners.

Farmington's only serious threat was in the third inning when Keller singled and stole second. Mennick caught Keller at the plate. **GAME IN DETAIL**

Board To Catalogue
State Owned Land

Auditor General, George T. Gundry, this week reminded the taxpayers of Michigan of the creation by the last Legislature, of a Land Board which will function as a coordinating agency for the removal of delinquent lands from State ownership.

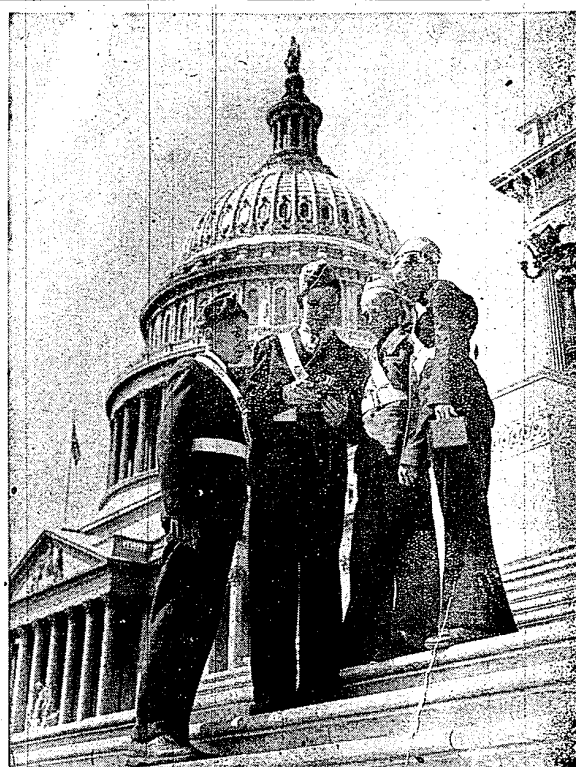
According to Gundry the new Land Board will begin to function on January 1, 1940, and will immediately catalogue all state-owned lands south of the Bay City-Muskegon line. State-owned land north of the line will be deeded to the Conservation Department to use as they see fit.

It is expected that much of this land will be converted to State Parks, forests and game reserves, while land handled by the Land Board will more generally be disposed of at public auction.

It is at these auctions, Gundry pointed out, that unneeded and delinquent property may be purchased by the public at a price set at not less than 25% of the assessed valuation.
