

10,000 FEET OF ROADS RECEIVE SPECIAL COATING

Auto drivers who use Farmington side roads find travel has been made much easier since the City workmen improved them. More than 10,000 lineal feet of roads have received special seal coats, according to Street Commissioner Emory Hutton.

These roads had to be conditioned for three years before clipped rock and cutback asphalt could be properly laid. Due to this process these streets are more durable and smoother. The City used 160 tons of clipped rock on these special roads and 6,440 gallons of cutback asphalt. A total of 13,920 gallons of road oil was poured, and 310 yards of sand was used to recondition Farmington's roads.

GRAND RIVER HAS 17,500 MAXIMUM AUTO FLOW HERE

Traffic on Grand River Road near Farmington has a maximum flow of 17,500 automobiles and trucks in 24 hours and a normal flow of 6,400 cars a day, according to figures recently released by the highway planning survey commission.

Travel reaches its heaviest volume in this area along Woodward avenue, north of the Detroit City limits where there is a maximum flow of 60,700 vehicles a day. Normal traffic at this point is 27,000 cars a day.

Variations in peak and normal travel on select trunklines picked at random include: US-10 between Pontiac and Detroit 12,000 and 11,000; US-10 between Pontiac and Flint 15,500 and 8,200; US-21 near Monroe 13,000 and 6,000; US-16 near Williamston, 9,000 and 4,000; US-27 north of Clare, 5,000 and 1,750; US-12 near the State line 16,200 and 1,100; and US-11 near Powers in Montcalm County 12,357 maximum and 432 average.

G. Donald Kennedy, deputy state highway commissioner, pointed out that the heaviest travel in Michigan comes during week ends in the summer. The peak is usually reached during the Labor Day week end.

"It would be impracticable to build highways to meet a one or two-day peak load," said Kennedy, "but there are many times during the year when the traffic is much heavier than the average. The state highway department believes that the highways should be built to meet a reasonable part of this recurring peak demand not only for the free movement of traffic but also for public safety."
