Arthur Mann, principal of Clarenceville's junior high school, has asked that new seventh graders report to the junior high cafeteria at 10:30 a.m. on the following days:

Former Botsford elementary school students on Monday, Aug. 30; former Grandview students, Tuesday, Aug. 31; former Edgewood students, Wednesday, Sept. 1; and former Westbrook students, Thursday, Sept. 2.

At the respective meetings lockers will be assigned, class schedules issued and general information about the start of school will be given.

SEMCOG Tells Aid To Oakland

The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) has submitted a "services rendered" report to the Oakland County Board of Commissioners.

E. Robert Turner, SEMCOG executive director, said the "multi-level, multi-purpose functions of SEMCOG make

difficult a simple distillation of procedures and value accounting of services."

He cited SEMCOG programs for processing federal grant applications for counties and communities, for regional planning, and for providing technical assistance to communities as types of services delaying cost-accounting.

AMONG THE SEMCOG services rendered Oakland County during the period Jan. 1, 1970 thru March 31, 1971, cited by Turner are the following:

For services of a coordinator for criminal justice planning, a cost of \$10,640 plus an accountable 217 man-hours in direct contact service to the county, both factors leading to the county's receipt of federal grants to establish its own criminal justice coordinator office.

Assistance by SEMCOG in obtaining a total of \$29,993 in federal funding for criminal justice programs.

Processing in grant review activity by the SEMCOG planning division of 14 federal and 11 state projects.

Elision assistance in flood control, solid waste disposal and water quality control procedures.

Providing data processing consultation, information, and census and related information for a variety of

county programs (planning, community colleges, health planning, housing).

THE OAKLAND County dues to SEMCOG in 1970 were \$5,000.

A revised dues schedule affecting all units of government that are SEMCOG members will become effective Jan. 1.

It will increase Oakland County's gross dues to \$81,567. Dues paid by local communities would be related to the county and assuming all present members continue, Oakland County's net dues would be \$59,506 - of \$4,506 more than the amount scheduled under a long-anticipated increase to be based on the 1970 census.

C'ville Bargains With 4 Unions

Negotiations between the Clarenceville Board of Education and the school district employees' four unions are proceeding "amiably," both sides say.

School administrators admit that negotiations on financial matters won't seriously begin until the amount of state aid to the school district is determined.

The Clarenceville Education Association, representing some 160 teachers, and the board of education are negotiating for a new contract to replace the current one-year pact that expires Aug. 31.

CONTRACTS with bus drivers, custodial and cafeteria, and secretarial employees do not expire this year although clauses in the

two-year agreements stipulate that negotiations be opened on "salary matters."

Daniel L. Kelly, CEA president, described negotiations with the school board as "amiable" and said both sides were meeting regularly.

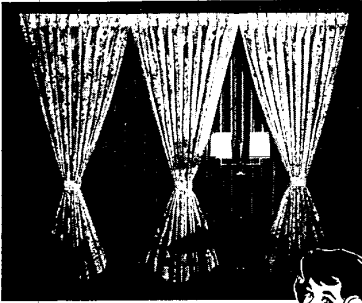
Howard Humble, administrative assistant and chief negotiator for the school board, said the board of education is waiting to find out how much state aid they will receive before bargaining seriously begins on salary matters with each of the unions.

Humble said the board would like to settle before teachers are due to report Sept. 7, but "there is no pressing deadline now." Clarenceville schools are scheduled to open Sept. 8.
