CHARLES L. WILSON

Mr. Wilson issued the following statement on his candidacy:

"For many years I have been preparing myself, both in the prosecutor's department and as counsel for the defense, to enter the race for Prosecutor of Oakland County on the Republican ticket. I believe I am adequately qualified to administer the duties of the Prosecutor's Office.

"Justice will be administered at every turn if I go into the prosecutor's office. I am bound to no clique or faction religiously or politically. I make this pledge—that if I am elected, I will devote my whole time and all my efforts to an energetic, constant and impartial administration of the duties of prosecuting the wrong and defending the right.

"I will ask the electors, by their votes in the Fall elections, to elect me to the job they want and should have done in the Prosecutor's office."

### METAL HALF YEAR LICENSES MEET WITH APPROVAL

The decision of Leon D. Cass, Secretary of State, to use metal license plates, instead of windshield stickers that were made outside the state, has met with universal approval.

Sales for the period ending June 23, 1938, of half year plates have reached 137,530 units as compared to the sale of 137,324 windshield stickers for the same period last year, or an increase in half year licenses of 159,765 units or approximately 10 per cent.

Branch offices report that economy rather than necessity has been the cause of the increase in sales of the half year plates. Many persons to whom the windshield stickers were objectionable in the past, have purchased the half year plates without hesitation. Owners of trucks, where the license fee runs into the higher brackets, have used this half year plate extensively.

The reduction of the rate for farm trucks to fifty cents per hundred weight has proved extremely popular with farmers who use their equipment only part of the year.

Enforcement officers generally recommended the plates instead of the half year stickers; Michigan being the only state with the half-year privilege. Michigan residents in other states were frequently required to explain the stickers. The half-year plates are self-evident.

Half year plates expire August 31, 1938.
