Breathing
Classes
Offered

A series of Adult Breathing Improvement classes will begin at 12 noon on Tuesday, Aug. 31, at Detroit Osteopathic Hospital under the co-sponsorship of the hospital and the Tuberculosis and Health Society of Wayne County.


Two sessions will be held a week for four weeks.

The program will be conducted by Robert Boesiger, a physical therapist, and Gene Grace, an inhalation therapist, under the direction of Donald Evans, D.O., medical director of the inhalation therapy department.

Persons with respiratory problems must be referred by their physician to participate in the program. A \$10 registration fee will be charged and will cover complete physical and tolerance examinations prior to being admitted to the class.

Patients remain under the care of their family physician at all times.

The program aims at helping patients understand and manage breathing difficulties through use of exercise and helping them adjust psychologically to their physical capabilities.
