

AMENDED VEHICLE LAW SAVES STATE FARMERS MONEY

Approximately \$250,000 we're saved to ithe farmers of Michigan this, year is a result of the enactment of an amendment to the Motor Vehicle Law by the 1937 Sesion of the State Legislature.

The amendment to the act reduced the license fee on vehicles used exclusively for farm use to flat rate of fifty cents per hundred, Prior to this year all farm trucks were assessed the regular fee charged to commercial trucks, the price; range of which was from \$5.55 to \$1,25 per hundred.

The amenument was urged upon the legislature by the Secretary of States as a just concession to the farmers of Michigan whose vehicles are used almost entirely most on the farm and used on the highways only incidental to their real use. This amended fee schedule applies also to hearses and am "bulances."

The 1939 license plates for farm The 1939 license plates for farm trucks will have inscribed on them the words, "Farm Comm." to afford protection to the State against any attempts at abuse of the provisions of the amended act. License plates for all motor vehicles may now be purchased at half price and may be used until March 1, 1939.
