European cables bring rumors of another impending financial crisis in France and hint at further devaluation of the franc. To bank-res, foreign exchange is a fascinating subject, but to the average layman it's all Greek. What makes currencies fluctuate? There are layman it's all Greek. What makes currencies fluctuate? There are usuny factors, of course, involving confidence in a government's political and economic stability. But international trade plays a big role, too. Suppose, for example, an English importer buys 1,000,000 bushels of corn in the U. S. at 50 cents a bushel; in doing so, he has to take his own' money pounds sterling—and bid for 500,000 American dollars in the money market. Just as at an auction, his bidding tends to boost the "price" of dollars. English papers that night will read, "Doular rises," white American papers at the same time will read, "Pound sterling declines." That's one reason why France, which has imported more goods than she has exported every year except two since 1920, has had a gradual decline in the value of its franc. If you are a hardy soul who likes fishing well enough to brave autumn's chill winds, this is the time of year when your chances are good for bringing in the best catches of the season. October is usually the best fishing month of the year, due chiefly to two factors.

Bass fishing often is the most productive, but catches of pike, bluegill and perch also are usually heavier in October than earlier in the season.

Compensation Head Asks Employers' Cooperation

Extreme care on the part of employers in correctly transcribing the Social Security Account numbers of their employees, was urged today by Executive Director Abner E. Larned, of the Michigan Unemployment Compensation Commission.

"One misplaced figure in a Social Security Account number is enough to disquality a worker from ben-fits," said Mr. Larned. "The in-correct number causes the appli-cant to lose his identity, as far as the records are concerned. "Careless transposition of digits in the number cause delay in pro-cessing a claim. It works untold injustice to the claimant. in some instances it deprives the unem-ployed applicant to funds when he most needs them.
