OUT OF TOWN MAIL SHOULD BE IN BY DEC. 16

Christmas parcels going out of town should be mailed before Dec. 16 (Friday) if they are surely going to be received before Christmas, according to the post office.

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A practice followed quite extensively this Christmas time is the mailing of letters with one and one-half cent stamps on them. This can be done if the flap of the envelope is left unsealed, but the sender makes certain concessions.

Persons sending Christmas cards with half postage should keep in mind the limited service they receive, the post office points out. In addition to these admonitions there is the customary warning that packages must be clearly addressed and carefully wrapped.

The Christmas rush season will make it necessary for the post office to put on extra help. There will probably be added at least two extra carriers to be at work on, he says.

If telephone cords are allowed to become twisted, some of the fine wires inside them may break. When this occurs, a rasping sound in the line results. Keeping the cords free from kinks and twists will help to safeguard the quality of the telephone service.

Care should be exercised also when using a scrub brush or mop, so that water will not dampen the telephone wiring near the floor. If the telephone is located near a window, the window should be closed when it is raining.

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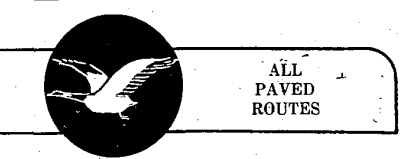
