

## Old Age Insurance Two Years Old

More than 75,000 workers in the area served by the Pontiac field office of the Social Security Board are entitled to join today in celebrating the second anniversary of the establishment of the Federal old-age insurance system.

This statement was made by Walter D. Redman, manager of the Pontiac field office, in summarizing progress made in this area and in the country as a whole since the social security program went into effect on Jan. 1, 1937.

"To the nation as a whole," said Mr. Redman, "more than 12,000,000 wage earners have applied for old-age insurance accounts. Our first office, since it was opened on Aug. 15, 1937, has issued more than 13,750 numbers for the residents of the two counties which we serve. In addition, it is estimated that more than \$1,000 social security numbers were issued by post offices in these two counties before we began to type numbers in our office in the Peoples State Building."

"Any worker who desires to know the status of his social security wage record for 1937 may get this information by applying on post cards which we will supply," Mr. Redman added.

The Pontiac office manager stressed the importance of the claims work done in the area which he serves.

"In the year 1938, 150 claims for lump-sum benefits, or money payments, now due under the old-age insurance plan and filed through our office, had been certified for payment," Mr. Redman said.

Mr. Kellough spent the rest of his stay with Mr. Brown and was elated when that afternoon he found the white schoolhouse crowded with persons who had not heard a sermon for years.
