HUNTERS WARNED AGAINST DANGER OF FIRES

High fire risk in Michigans forests has brought a special appeal to the state's half million small game hunters to be careful when they take to the fields and woods this fall.

Weeks of fine weather have left the woods extremely dry and fallen leaves have so increased the fire hazard that lookouts in fire towers beyond the usual October 18 layds of conservation reported today. Only heavy fall rains will change the situation materfally.


