Mrs. Richard Foy and Mrs. John Armstrong, serving as co-chairmen, have suggested that festival goers begin their tour of activities at the junior high school, where the large parking area behind the school will be available. It is a two-block walk from there to Kellogg Park. This is the first year the Arts Council

This is the first year the Arts Council has attempted such a show and proceeds will go toward financing its year-around program of bringing cultural attractions into Plymouth schools. It also hopes to schedule an appearance of the new Michigan Artrain in Plymouth in 1972.
