

Fairs, Festivals Bring State Plenty Of Fun

Michigan's oldest and largest fair, a parade of antique cars, an historic homes tour and snowmobile drag races are among the 10 major attractions Michigantians may enjoy from Sept. 9-12, according to Automobile Club of Michigan.

The 122nd annual Michigan State Fair in Detroit, through Sept. 12, is a highlight of where to go and what to do in the Wolverine State.

Nearly 50,000 visitors are expected for a Fall Festival at Plymouth Sept. 9-12. Civic organizations throughout the community are sponsoring the event.

MARSHALL'S yearly historic homes tour Sept. 11, will feature eight century-old homes, pleasant tree-shaded sidewalks, blazing colors of Civil War uniforms and the surroundings of a 19th-century community. The

event is sponsored by the Marshall Historical Society. An old-fashioned rodeo is the main event at Charlotte's frontier day, Sept. 10-12. An ox roast, medicine show, parade, square dance and antique show also will be held.

A total of 350 vintage autos, dating from 1899 to 1925, will be on display for the old car festival at Dearborn's Greenfield Village on Sept. 11-12. All festival participants will be dressed in period costumes.

WINTER SPORTS enthusiasts will get a jump on the season with two special programs scheduled. 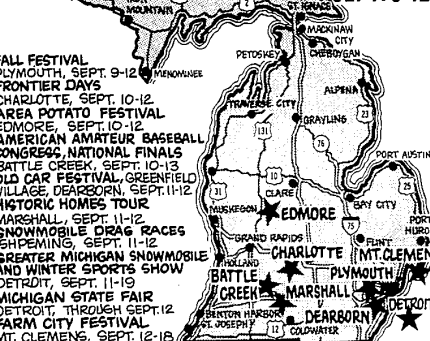
Tuition of \$75 per course covers all costs, including texts and homework assignment forms, except postage for sending homework assignments to the "personal professor."

Dennis is a graduate of Ferris State University.

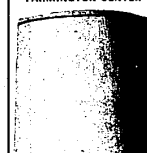
