Great Johnstown Flood

Caused by Breaking Dam

There was only one great Johnstown Flood

There was only one great Johnstown food. This occurred on Friday, May 31, 1880, and was caused by the breaking of the dam at Conemangh lake, which released a huge reservoir of water that rushed madly down the Conemangh valley, washing out its villages and harding itself in a deadly torrent on the city of Johnstown.

The bursting of the dam was due to the unprecedented and long-continued rains, which resulted not only in this disaster, but which the disaster is the continued on the disaster. In the disaster, but only in this disaster, but which there was even greater loss of property than its Johnstown.

Warning of the impending danger was given the inhabilatas of Johnstown by railroad officials and others, but many disregarded them.

The final break of the dam came at three o'clock in the atternoon, and there was a sound like tremendous and continued claps of thorder. In an hour's time Johnstown was wrecked and ruined. The loss of life was between 200 and 3,000,000.
