

# Congress' Religious Balance Will Undergo Little Change

The religious balance among members of the 90th Congress will be generally maintained in the 91st, though several denominations least represented in politics show small gains, according to the religious census of Congress published in Christianity Today. Noting that "1968 was a good year for incumbents," the magazine says totals of only two religious groups changed by more than one. The number of Roman Catholics in the House and Senate rose two, to 111. The Methodists, largest Protestant group in the Congress,

The Methodists, largest Pro-testant group in the Congress, dropped three to 90.

It finds the affuent, largely— white, British-background de-nominations rank highest when their total of Congress mem-bers is compared with the church membership test. The leaders are the Unitarian-Uni-versalists, Presbyterlans, versalists, Presbyterians, Episcopallans, and the United Church of Christ.
