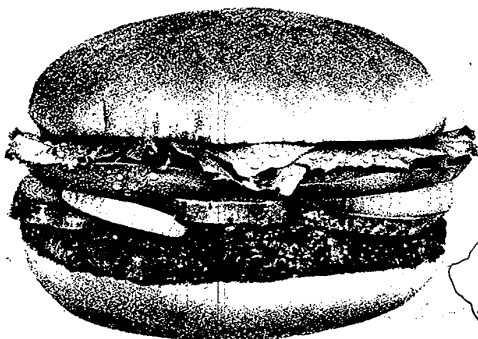

Violinist To Solo With Symphony

Petite Korean Violinist Kyung Wha Chung, a Leventritt award winner, will make her Detroit debut with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in concert Thursday and Saturday, Dec. 12 and 14.

Miss Chung will perform the Stravinsky Violin Concerto.

Vaiyter Poole will conduct. The concert will be at 8:30 p.m. in Ford Auditorium.

Orchestral works on both evenings will be the Vivaldi-Sibelius Concerto in D minor, Richard Strauss' "Eine Scene der Seven Vells," and Saint-Saens' Symphony No. 3 -- the latter with Frederick Marriot as organ soloist.

Miss Chung won the Leventritt award, the most coveted among violinists and pianists, in 1967. The award is given only when the judges believe a young artist is capable of starting a major career immediately. Previous winners include Van Cliburn, Gary Graffman and John Browning.

"I've found that the award is a big responsibility. I must prove myself over and over during concerts," Miss Chung told a reporter in 1967.

Since then she has made a coast-to-coast tour of the United States.

Miss Chung was born in Seoul.

Rackham Choir Sets Free Concert

The Rackham Symphony Choir will offer a free public concert Tuesday, Dec. 17, at 8:30 p.m. in the Rackham Building auditorium, Farmington at Woodward.

The Rackham Choir, official choir of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, will present a varied program under the direction of Maynard Klatz, who is also the distinguished director of choral at the University of Michigan.

The program will include Cantata 142, "To Us a Child is Born" by J.S. Bach, Bach chorales, the Swiss cantata "Natus Est," selections from Mendelssohn's "Elijah," and the Christmas section of Handel's "Messiah."

A select women's ensemble will perform Paul Vidal's "Chanson des Anges" ("Song of the Angels") and Orlando di Lasso's "Hodie Apparuit."

"Mary Had a Baby" will be sung by the Men's Choir with tenor soloist.

Traditional carols by the choir and audience will conclude the concert.

Charles Heard (supervisor of vocal music, Wayne Public Schools), is assistant conductor of the 250 - voice choir.

Tear Jerker Closes Early Movie Series

Jackie Cooper and Mary Astor star in the 1935 production, "Dinky," at the Henry Ford Museum Sunday, Dec. 15.

"Dinky" is an unashamed tearjerker of the type popular with American audiences in the mid-1930's complete with an unjustly imprisoned mother, a lovable little boy badly treated at a military academy, and, of course, the conviving villain.

Everyone suffers greatly, but as usual it all turns out right in the end.

Jackie Cooper is an outstanding example of an American phenomenon: the child star. His name is on the list of others like Shirley Temple, Freddy

Bartholomew, Jane Withers, and Bobby Breen were enough by themselves to draw crowds into the movie theaters.

Parents all over the country dreamed of getting their own children into the movies, but of the millions who tried, only a few succeeded even to a slight degree, and none broke into this exclusive circle.

"Along Came Dinky," a 1940 cartoon, is also on the program which is the last in the museum's fall series of Famous Early Movies.

Showings are at 2 and 4 p.m. and are free to museum visitors. The winter series of movies begins Jan. 5, 1969.

Comic Opens At 24-Karat
