

# Poverty Budget Approved

The budget request and plan of work for 1969 were reviewed and approved at the Nov. 25 meeting of the governing board of the OCCEO (Oakland County Commission on Economic Opportunity).

The budget and work plan are the final phase of the application procedure for 1969 funding of Oakland County's anti-poverty agency.

OCCEO's total funding is divided into five current program accounts, all of which are incorporated into the 1969 funding application.

Two accounts -- Head Start and Legal Services -- have been previously approved.

The remaining three accounts -- Neighborhood Services Systems, Community Action Agency (CAA) Administration, and Senior Opportunities -- were approved at the Monday night meeting.

The CAA Administration account provides program development, back-up and technical service, research and evaluation to all OCCEO programs in the county.

The second program receiving Commission approval was Neighborhood Services Systems, which has as its objectives community outreach and development. This program will be conducted through the establishment of 10 neighborhood service units and a network of detached service units located throughout the county.

The neighborhood units will be the result of a decentralization of OCCEO's former client services through two large centers. Neighborhood units will be managed by unit supervisors and by community aides, many of whom are drawn from the poverty area residents served by OCCEO. The Neighborhood Services Program will work closely with OCCEO's seven program priorities for 1969.

The priorities have been identified through a total of 39 public meetings held in all parts of the county. These priorities are employment and training, housing, school related programs, transportation, senior citizens programs, day care, and increased community development.

NEIGHBORHOOD service goals also include the solution of individual needs of clients. Citizens in low-income families are helped to realize their inherent potential without the debilitating effects of lack of education, under employment and unemployment, and medical and family problems.

These goals are to be achieved through the use of OCCEO contracted professional services such as legal services, family and personal counseling, budget counseling, and informal education workshops.

The third program approved at the Commission meeting was Senior Opportunities and Services.

The OCCEO budget and plan of work will be forwarded to the Office of Economic Opportunity's Great Lakes Regional Office for study and action.
