## Faculty Fighting Injunction

Rather than report for work as ordered by an Oakland County circuit judge, most of Oakland Community College's faculty members reported to the court house in Pontiac on Monday and Tuesday to fight an injunction against their strike.

At the request of the college's administration, Circuit Judge William Beer issued an injunction against the strike that began Friday morning after the college and faculty failed to reach an agreement on a one-year contract.

The 300-member faculty began the strike after the board of trustees failed Thursday to ratify a contract calling for a \$400 increase over one year plus a \$30 per month cost of living increase.

A NUMBER of the college's 15,000 students reported for classes on Monday before being informed that faculty members had voted in an early morning meeting to go to court contesting the injunction. The strike affects the estimated 6,000 students at the Orchard Ridge campus in Farmington.

By early Tuesday morning, the administration had offered to extend last year's contract. Faculty members were reportedly meeting in the courthouse to vote on whether to accept the offer.

Prior to Tuesday's meeting, faculty chief negotiator Rod Chase said the dispute stemmed from confusion over the effect of the wage-price freeze on the salary schedule. Representatives from the college administration would not comment on the dispute.

"Our objective is to complete the semester which we have already attempted to begin," Chase said. "We hope that the board will ratify our contract before significant numbers of students are lost or inconvenienced."

## P.O.-BOX Drugs

Q. Isn't there any way to stop drug abuse by stopping production of any kind of drugs that get abused? Mrs. M. S. Livonia

A. No way. After all, the term "abuse" implies that there is a good or legitimate use that is being improperly channeled. To implement your idea, we would have to stop production of all drugs for severe pain, of all general anesthetics, of all tranquilizers and the list is much longer.

Another problem is the fact that not merely drugs, but a whole list of other chemicals, are being abused: such things as paint thinners, cleaning fluids, commercial solvents for example. Some kids have tried to get high inhaling gasoline, and some have died in the attempt. Does this mean that this nation should have its transportation system come to a halt?

What it means is that although we should make every effort to control the production and distribution of substances - such as heroin - which serve no earthly good, we must address ourselves to the problem of educating our children and ourselves to live in a world literally inundated with chemicals of almost every sort imaginable.

Q. Isn't it true that the really dangerous drugs are synthetic chemicals? A lot of kids I've talked to say that natural drugs like marijuana and mescaline are safe, or at least a lot safer than the other man-made chemicals.

A. As in most falsehoods, there's a small grain of truth in this idea. Agreed that marijuana and mescaline are safer - but only relatively safer - than synthetics such as "speed" (a dangerous stimulant) or LSD (a powerful mind-altering drug).

But the concept begins to break down almost immediately. What about the semi-synthetics - naturally occurring chemicals slightly altered by man? Should they be only half-dangerous? Considering that heroin is a classic example of this half-natural, half-synthetic category, the answer would have to be "No."
