REPORT SHOWS BETTER BUSINESS CONDITIONS

Evidence of pronounced improvement in business conditions was seen today in a report issued by Harry A. McDonald, Chairman of the Michigan Unemployment Compensation Commission, covering benefit payments during January.

benefit payments survived during January.
Benjefit payments issued during January dropped in value to less than half the total during the corresponding month of 1939 according to McDonaid.
The 147,947 benefit payments issued during January, 1940, had a total value of \$1,760,095, as compared with the 282,335 chegks worth \$3,661,088 issued in January 1939.

Benefit payments to workers from all major industrial groups, except. Recreation and Amusement, decreased in value during January 1940, as compared with the same

1340, as compared with the same month last year. For the one industry excepted, arise of 1.25 percent to \$50,854 was noted.

Declines in seasonal employment reduced increases over December in the value or benefit payments to workers from most industries during January, 1940, but a sharp drop in payments to automotive workers reduced the net gludance for all payments to less than twelve per cent.

Willie payments to workers last employed by manufacturers of autorinolles, bodies and parts dropped 40 per cent in value between December and January, the value of payments for all other invustries advanced 40 per cent.

The only major industry besides, autorinolle manufacturing to show a decrease from December was autorinolle manufacturing. Payments to workers in those Industries dropped III per cent.

Because of the sharp idecrease in Jinuary, benefit payments to workers last employed in the autorinolle mattry constituted an unusually small proportion of the total value of all payments during this inonth.

During the entire year of 1932, the \$19,401,908 lissued to unemployed automobile workers' represented 52 per cent of the total of 337,180,378 issued during the year. But the \$341,478 in payments to autonioolile workers during January, 1940, comprised only 19 per cent of the total for the mouth.

SUGAR BEET SEED WILL NOT BE AFFECTED BY WAR

Michigan need not worry about its 1940 supply of sugar beet seed ac was necessary a quarter of a century ago in the "first" World War.

Adjled to what little has been filtering out of faily, or previously imported and held over, growers in southwest states have seen to it that there is sufficient variable at a reasonable cost. Thus the planning of Michigam's 140,000 acres in the ax few months can proceed, war or no war, even though sugar beet growers in this state alone will require about two miltibn pounds of seed.

Before 1914 seed came largely from Germany. The price was 7 to 1 cents a pound, f. o. b. Hamburg reports J. G. Lill, sugar beet specialist of the United States Department of Agriculture and stationed at Michigan State College. War conditions made it impossible to get more than a portion of the usual seed supply. American seed producing methods helped out, but using European practices innde the seed cost from 50 cents to, three times that a pound.
