SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATIONS MEET COMPETITION

A "buyer's market" is now in force in the home-financing field, making it necessary for savings and loan associations, the largest single group of home mortgage lenders, to meet all interest rate competition by other lenders "who are invading the associations' traditional field," Fred W. Catlett, chairman of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board, said this week.

Competition for loans on homes has become keen because of the lack of wide industrial investment opportunities for banks and other financial institutions, and because of the great abundance of savings in all types of thrift institutions, Mr. Catlett declared.

Despite the assaults of aggressive competitors, savings and loan associations not only are maintaining their traditional importance in the field by making at least one-third of the home mortgage loans in the nation but they are showing a growing strength in practically every section of our country, according to reliable mortgage statistics," he pointed out.

"Last year's home-financing figures contain encouragement and warning for the savings and loan business: encouragement because they demonstrate that the savings and loan business in strong financial and resourceful enough not only to hold its own but to gain strength in the face of the most widespread invasion of its field that has ever occurred; a warning because the figures show that some of the mortgage lenders are becoming stronger individually."
