Gentlemen:

I have made an examination of the cash receipts and disbursements record of the Livonia Township School District No. 2, for the period July 14, 1940 to June 30, 1941.

The scope of my examination was in accordance with your letter to me of July 5, 1941, a copy of which is attached hereto.

All moneys received from the township treasurer and the county treasurer (as indicated by remittance advices preserved by the school board treasurer) as well as miscellaneous moneys received from various sources, were duly deposited in the bank.

Disbursements from the bank appeared to be legitimate, and substantially all of them were supported by invoices, bills, contracts, and so forth, as well as by canceled checks duly and properly endorsed.

The bank balances at the end of the period were verified by independent confirmation from the depository.

You are hereby engaged to scrutinize and verify the cash receipts and disbursements of the Livonia Township School District No. 2, for the period July 14, 1940 to June 30, 1941. The specifications covering your examination are as follows:

- (1) A general scrutiny of the cash record maintained by the school board treasurer.
  - (2) Verification of the entries contained therein by comparing with invoices, bills, remittance advices, teachers contracts, and other supporting data to be supplied by the treasurer and secretary.
  - (3) You are to independently confirm the balances in the general and debt service bank accounts, both of which are maintained in the Farmington State Bank, Farmington, Michigan. Aside from this, you are not required to go beyond the available data in carrying out your examination.
  - (4) You are to render a report on your findings addressed to the School Board.

#### Old Cars Still Used

Still on the roads are more than one-third of all the automobiles and trucks ever produced in the United States, says the American Petroleum Industries committee. ### Mich. Hospital Service Liberalizes Benefits

To the 450,000 residents of Michigan who are members of Michigan Hospital Service the liberalization of hospital benefits under the plan will be welcome news. Especially will it be of interest to expectant mothers whose certificates would not have been in effect for the usual twelve month waiting period for maternity benefits at the time of confinement.

Extension in Benefits  
Prior to this time subscribers were required to be enrolled in the plan for twelve months before being entitled to maternity service. Now the waiting period is reduced to ten months.

The new certificate provides for the enrollment of all children under sixteen years of age. Hereafter children under one year old were not eligible.

In addition to the above extensions, the hospitals have agreed to provide subscribers with all drugs and dressings, as well as the rendering of a more complete laboratory service.

The above changes apply to all members and become effective immediately. "In the face of rising prices and higher costs of living it is a pleasure to announce a further liberalization in benefits," stated John R. Mann, Director of Michigan Hospital Service.

Second Extension  
This is the second time Michigan Hospital Service has increased its benefits. On February 2, 1940, the plan eliminated all exemptions in the agreements with subscribers and guaranteed service for all types of cases, including tuberculous conditions, pulmonary tuberculosis and mental diseases. Like-
