Historic old Fort Jefferson, abandoned as a military post in 1874 and made a national moment by President Rosevelt January 4, 1935, has been made accessible to Florida vistors by the National Parks service.

A iri-weekly boat service has been for the service of the Dry Tortusas islands. Docking and anchorage facilities also have been provided for private craft.

The fort was built on an island in 1840 as the key defense of the Gulf of Mexico, and although it was abandoned as a military post in 1874, troops are still stationed there10 years lated.

It was on this island that Dr. Samuel A. Mudd, Maryland physician who set John Wilkes Bouth's broken leg following the assassination of President Lincoln, was implement.

School for Crime Prevention
"Bringing the law to the child instead of bringing the child to the
aw," by teaching crime prevention law," by teaching crime prevention in the public schools has been rec-ommended by Harold H. Krowech, chalrman of the state bar commit-tee of Los Angeles, studying juvenile crime. The committee turther rec-ommended in a statement issued by Krowech that parents read newspa-per accounts of crime to children, per accounts of crime to children, stress the penalites imposed by the courts and point out that crime brings suffering to innocent persons. "Authorities realize that juvenile courts can only punish offenders," Krowesh said, "and they concur in our plan to teach children about crime and its pitfulls before and child has committed a crime."
