LELAND STOWE IS NEXT SPEAKER AT TOWN HALL

Leland Stowe, noted war correspondent for the Chicago Daily News and Detroit News, will speak on "Hitler Over Europe" before the Detroit Town Hall in the Fisher Theatre, Wednesday, February 19, at 11 a. m.

Stowe arrived in New York by Atlantic Clipper February 5 after several months at the Greek-Albanian front. It was his first glimpse of his family and homeland since 1939. Since then he has covered the war from England, Finland, Norway, Roumania and Greece.

Stowe's colorful accounts of little Finland's gallant struggle against overwhelming odds, and his revelations of an "inside job" which spurred the capitulation of Norway, won him the rating of America's No. 1 war correspondent.

Again and again his scoops have flashed into front page headlines. During his 15 years as foreign correspondent, he has reported three uprisings in Spain, the overthrow of ten governments in France, the trans-Atlantic flights of Lindbergh, the World Disarmament at London in 1932, and the recent Pan American conferences in South America.

St. L. A. Marshall, military expert for the Detroit News, will introduce Mr. Stowe.

TO OPEN DRIVE FOR FUNDS FOR COUNTY HOSPITALS

Mrs. John J. Schulte will act as Farmington chairman in a county-wide fund drive to relieve the desperate situation concerning Oakland County Hospitals. Mr. Henry Scripps Booth of Bloomfield Hills, is general chairman of the Drive Committee.

This drive is for \$100,000 for the expansion of the facilities at St. Joseph's Mercy Hospital. Assisting Mr. Booth in the campaign are more than four score leading and prominent citizens throughout the county.

Desperate Situation Exists "It has been known for the past few years that a critical situation exists concerning our hospitals in Oakland County. For a considerable length of time the hospitals in this county have been overcrowded with no reserve room should there occur some disaster or epidemic in our communities.

Both major hospitals in Oakland County are now operating about 34% beyond their capacity. The demands for service have been constantly increasing during the past year and one-half. It has come to a crisis which affects the future of all persons in our County.
