



ORDINANCE
(Continued From Page Four)

No permit shall be issued to any person or persons to open any fire hydrant and/or to use water therefrom in the Township for a period beginning April 1st and ending October 15th in any year or portion of said period unless and until said person or persons shall make a deposit of Five Dollars (\$5.00) with the Water Department. Upon the expiration of the time for which a permit has been issued and/or when the permit shall be surrendered to the Water Department, the Water Department shall immediately inspect said fire hydrant and estimate the damage, if any, to said fire hydrant, resulting from its opening and/or use under the said permit. After deducting the amount of said damage so estimated, the balance of said deposit if any, shall be refunded by the Water Department.

In the discretion of the Water Department, permits may be issued for opening and use of water to other persons or families, firm, company or corporation except by permission of the Township Board or permit any unnecessary waste of water. If found doing so the supply of water may be shut off at the option of the Township.

Article 4. No cross-connection between pipes connected with the Township Water Supply System and another source of water supply shall be permitted for any purpose whatsoever.

Article 5. The supply of water to any land or premises when the ordinance of the Township and rules and regulations of the Water Department have in any manner been violated. If any person shall, after the water has been shut off from any premises, cause or suffer such premises to be supplied with water without permission from the Water Department, such premises shall be disconnected from the distribution pipe of the Water Department.

SECTION VII. WATER RATE COLLECTION

Article 1. The Owner or occupant of any land or premises against which water rates shall be assessed shall pay the same to the Water Department monthly or quarterly annually according to such rules and regulations as may be adopted from time to time by the Township Board.

Bills for all meters 1½ inch and larger size shall be rendered monthly and for all meters less than 1½ inch in size shall be rendered quarterly.

Water bills shall be payable on or before due date without discount. Bills not paid on or before the last net payment date as indicated on the face of the bill shall be subject to a ten percent penalty charge. Customers whose bills are unpaid thirty days after due date shall be forwarded a shut off notice and if bills are not paid within fifteen (15) days after the shut-off notice, the customer's service shall be then (turned off immediately without further notice. An additional penalty of One Dollar (\$1.00) will then be charged to the customer and shall be paid together with all unpaid charges before service will be turned on again.

The Township reserves the right to shut off the supply of water to any customer without preliminary notice for any reason whatsoever, if the Township reserves the specific right, power and authority to cut off the supply of water any time without incurring any liability or cause of action for damages, any regulation to the contrary notwithstanding, and the Township shall not be liable under any circumstances for a deficiency or failure in the supply of water.

Article 2. For all meters 1½ inch and smaller, the charge for water shall begin upon the day when the installation of the service to the property line is completed. During the time interval from the time the service to the property line is completed and the meter is set, the customer will be charged for water at the proportionate minimum rate per quarter.

SECTION VIII. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1. Any person, firm or corporation violating the terms of this ordinance shall upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), or may be imprisoned, not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Article 2. Each section of this ordinance and every paragraph of each section is hereby declared to be separable, and the holding of any section or any part thereof to be void, ineffective or unconstitutional for any cause, shall not affect any other section or part thereof.

Article 3. A public hearing shall be held before this Ordinance shall become effective, and notice of the time and place of such hearing shall be given by one publication in a paper of general circulation in this township not less than seven days prior to such hearing, and a hearing be granted any person interested at the time and place specified.

Article 4. This ordinance after its passage, shall be published within seven days by publication at least once in a newspaper circulating within the Township.

Article 5. The Township Clerk shall certify on the record the date of publication and the manner of publication and such certificate shall be prima facie evidence of the facts therein stated.

Article 6. This ordinance shall become effective from and after thirty days from its first publication after adoption by the Township Board.




