Plan Facilities For Public Fishing Site

Construction of a drive and parking area now underway on the Lake Chemung public fishing site is the first such development on any of the three-acre access areas purchased with fishing license money.

The \$1,000 job on the Lake Chemung site includes the sinking of a well, providing of sanitary facilities, and posting the spot with signs, as well as providing accommodation for fishermen's cars. Floyd Fanslow of the conservation department's fish division is supervising the work.

Improvement of public fishing sites is to vary with the topography and use of each particular area. Scheduled to begin soon is an extensive development of the public fishing site on Orchard Lake.



70-Foot Cedar Tree Survives Windstorm

A huge cedar tree, more than 11 feet in circumference and 70 feet high has been discovered in Bull Run swamp, in Higgins Lake state forest northeast of Shorn, by CCC crews cleaning up an area hard hit in a recent windstorm. Foreman Bert Darke, a veteran woodsman, says it is the largest cedar he has ever seen, and CCC boys have named it "Great Granddaddy."

Near the rare old survivor another cedar of 17-inch stump diameter was blown down. After counting its annual rings, CCC boys estimated the smaller tree's age at nearly 400 years.
