${\it Barberries~Overlooked},$ Make Good Barriers

Are barberries such common shrubs that they are bining overlooked? They are a handsome group of plants that include both evergreen and leaf-losing kinds. They should be used more often in land scape planting.

Most barberries bear attractive waxy yellow flowers in early spring, which are followed later in the season by red, purple or blue-black fruits about one-quarter inch in tength.

THE COMMON berberry (Berberis vulgaris) has showy red fruits, but should not be used in landscape planting. It is an alternate host for the rust disease of wheat.

The rust fungus spends part of its life eyde on wheat and other cereal plants and part of its cycle on common barberry and other plants. It helps prevent spread of the rust disease if there are no common barberry plants grown where wheat its grown. Fortunately, there are other equally attractive barberries that are not infected by the rust and can be safely planted. 'A good substitute for the

This is a dense plant that grows about five feet full but can be kept pruned to a lower height. The small green leaves tunbilliant scarle in fall. The red berries strung along the branches stay plump and fresh all winter. The plants are especially attractive in spring when they are laden simultaneously with fresh new leaves, wary yellow flowers and the still fresh red fruits from the preceding year.

The Japanese barberry grows in almost any kind of soil and is noted for its ability to withstand dry situations. It is a sturdy dependable shrub that can be used as a specimen plant, in a background screen planting, for an informal hedge, or clipped into a trim tailored hedge.

It is such a common old-fashioned shrub that has been used and misused for so long that its value is not fully realized.

THE RED-LEAVED variety of Japanese barberry seems even more common than the species. It makes a good accent plant, but care must be taken when using it in foundation plantings not to get a spotty, busy effect.

The variety "minor" is a small form that is never more than four feet high. Because of its small teaves it is called the "Box barberry". It makes a neat hedge plant. The variety "erecta" grows with an upright form. This, too, is a good hedge plant. Of special interest is the pygmy red barberry, a very dwarf redleaved form, that is good in the rock garden or as a specimen plant in a small Japanese-style garden. It is also effective used as a border in front of other strubs.

The wildfire barberry (B. gilgiana) is another good substitute for the seammon barberry, and so is the Korean barberry (B.Koreana.) Both grow about six feet high and have pendant clusters of red berries.

There are some evergreen barberries that have proved perfectly hardy in this area. One of the bardlest and handsomest is Juliana barberry. It forms a dense shrub, six feet high, clothed with spiny leathery leaves. It is a beautiful shrub that is attractive all year.

Somewhat smaller is the warty barberry (8. veruculosa). This compact evergreen barberry is especially interesting because the lower sides of the leaves are silver colored, making a pretty contrast with the deep green upper surface. In autumn the follage gets a broazy funge.

The black barberry (B. gagnepaini) is reported to grow as well in New England as in California. Perhaps hardiest of all evergreen barberries is the threespine barberry (B. tricanthophora) which grows four feet tall.
