A meeting of the newly-formed Concerned Parents of Clarenceville to discuss the bussing issue has been scheduled for 8 p.m. Monday at Schmidt Auditorium, 20155 Middle Belt Rd., Livonia.

According to Gertrude Walsh, acting chairman of the new group, featured speakers will include: Mrs. Irene McCabe, outspoken Pontiac bussing opponent; Dr. Martin Wechsler, president of the Clarenceville school board; and David B. McDowell, Clarenceville superintendent of schools.

## Some Dem Leaders Oppose Bus Statement

The State Central Committee of the Democratic Party adopted a policy to support bussing despite opposition in at least one local congressional district.

The Wayne County 19th District voted last week to oppose bussing, and the district's two delegates voted for the motion to table the issue at Saturday's state meeting, according to Chairman Bill Robbins.

The district, which includes Redford Township, Livonia and Northville city, will "continue with our original position," Robbins said Monday.

"Our position still stands," Robbins said. "They passed a policy statement and that doesn't have the effect and force of law."

Vagnozzi did not know how the six delegates to the State Central meeting voted on the motion to table the bussing question. It failed in a 67-40 vote.

The statement adopted by state Democrats in a voice vote said in part: "We accept bussing as an imperfect and temporary mechanism to help

erase the imbalances in our educational system."

The chairman of the 15th Congressional District, John Canfield, was on vacation and could not be interviewed, and 2nd district chairman Bob Dwyer could not be reached for comment.

## Edison Rate Hike Hearings Set

Dates for the start of public hearings on requests for rate increases sought by Consumers Power Co. and Detroit Edison Co. were announced recently.

The Michigan Commerce Department's Public Service Commission said hearings on Consumers Power's application to increase its gas rates by \$26.1 million annually will start in Lansing Oct. 26.

THE PROPOSED 9.1 per cent rate increase would be spread among the utility's 840,000 gas customers in 800 Michigan communities. The hearings will be conducted by Examiner Charles T. Sheridan.

Public hearings on Detroit Edison's request for a \$70.1 million annual rate hike will open in Detroit Nov. 3 where one and possibly two days of hearings will be held in the City-County Building Auditorium.

The hearings, which will be conducted by Chief Examiner Alfred Sullivan, will shift to Lansing on Nov. 9. Detroit Edison serves 1.5 million customers in 13 Southeastern Michigan counties.

Both utilities said they need rate increases to offset increases in labor, financing, equipment and construction costs.

## Student Strike Seeds Sown

The seed for a student anti-Viet war strike in November has been planted in local communities, but whether it will grow remains to be seen.

Lee Artz, of the Student Mobilization Committee at Wayne State University, said his group has made contacts at Schoolcraft College, Oakland Community College, Clarenceville High School, Southfield High School, and Stevenson High School in Livonia.

JERRY GIST, editor of Schoolcraft's newspaper, the Campus Globe, said that an actual movement for a student strike on Nov. 3 has not formed on the campus yet, though a number of students have expressed sympathy for it.

Schoolcraft's Student Senate, the student governing body, has not taken action either endorsing or opposing the strike.

Debbi Bustin from SMC spoke to more than 75 students at the college last week concerning the strike.

Due to a faculty strike on the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College, students are not attending classes and could not be reached for comment regarding strike plans.

Some Clarenceville students reportedly met with SMC representatives at WSU last week but have not started a movement in the high school for the strike.

Regional demonstrations for peace are scheduled on Nov. 6.

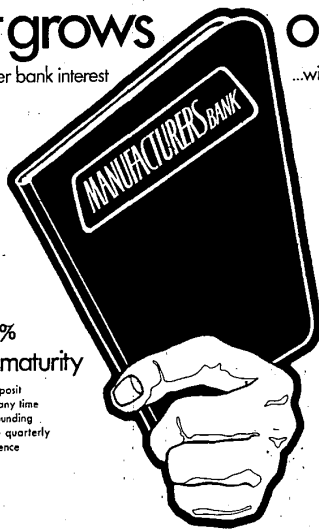
