MAGNESIUM BEARING VEIN OF ORE DISCOVERED

Airplane manufacturers may profit from the discovery that a large field of serpentine, also known as verde antique marble, found near Ishpeming has a higher metallic magnesium content than dolomite.

The beautiful greenish-white marble has a magnesium content of more than 19 per cent, according to an analysis reported by O. F. Poindexter of the conservation department's geology division. Dolomite is 12 per cent magnesium. Serpentine has been used almost exclusively as an ornamental building stone and in the manufacture of terrazzo and stucco. Magnesium is used in lightweight alloys for airplane construction.

Recent discovery of a 68 acre deposit of similar stone in Georgia was announced with the prediction that it would increase domestic magnesium production by 30 per cent. Georgia geologists assert that the magnesium may be extracted from this ore (technically described as magnesium silicate) at a favorably low cost.

ORIGIN OF POPPY DAY

The custom of wearing poppies in memory of the World War dead sprang up spontaneously in many places during the winter of 1918-19, close of the war, inspired by the poem, "In Flanders Fields," by Colonel John McCrae. First wearing of the poppies in America took place in New York City two days after the signing of the Armistice. The poppy was adopted as the memorial flower of The American Legion in 1920, and similar action was taken at the American Legion Auxiliary's first national convention in 1921.

HIGHWAY DEPT. RENAMES MACKINAC STRAITS CARRIERY

State Highway Commissioner G. Donald Kennedy announced this week that "City of Petoskey" had been selected as the new name for the former carriery "Pere Marquette No. 17" which was purchased by the state highway department last fall for service at the Straits of Mackinac.

The Commissioner said that the vessel was now undergoing alterations at the Great Lakes Engineering Works, at River Rouge, and was scheduled to be ready for service late in May. The boat was purchased from the railroad company last fall when the Department sold two of its small ferry boats to the United States Government for national defense duty.

"The name, 'City of Petoskey,' was selected because it is typical of northern Michigan and because this resort community is located close to the Straits region," Kennedy said. "The last boat to be inaugurated in the Straits service was the 'City of Munising,' representing an Upper Peninsula community."

The addition of the "City of Petoskey" to the State fleet will give the department four state-owned vessels, three of which have a capacity of more than 100 vehicles each. The "Straits of Mackinac," the fourth boat, has a capacity of approximately 90 vehicles.

Kennedy said that christening ceremonies would probably be held just previous to Memorial Day at Petoskey under the sponsorship of local civic groups.

Wild Animals Suffer From Highway Traffic When the toll taken by fast highway traffic is added up, count among the needless losses the lives of many game animals. In three months of routine patrol in southern Michigan conservation officers observed these victims of fast wheeling traffic: 1,020 rabbits, 234 pheasants, 214 squirrels, 38 skunks, 36 opossums, 34 muskrats, seven deer, five quail, four raccoons and 21 other game animals. As spring advances, increasing numbers will be endangered. Conservation officers say care in driving would save the lives of most of them.
