Flood Reduces Rate of Trout Fingerling Output

Only three of the eight ponds at the flood-damaged Otter River trout rearing station will be put in operation this season, but the station's 350,000 fingerling capacity will be reduced just a third by the damage, the conservation department has reported.

Repairs amounting to \$1,000 are being made to the Otter river head dam and bridge, of which the superstructure was washed away by the flash flood that did extensive damage throughout the Copper country. The sudden, 10-foot rise drove caretaker Axel Kyllonen and

his wife from the station wading waist deep, and flood waters cut away the stream banks to within six feet of the cabin, which is rated one of the most picturesque in the peninsula.


Final decision on rebuilding the Bear creek dam which supplied water for the station's five smaller ponds has not yet been made. Repairs would cost \$3,000 to \$4,000.

Encouragement of heavier perch and bluegill fishing, even including a moderate amount of winter fishing for these species, is recommended by the conservation department's institute for fisheries research, for improvement of fishing in Little Lake of Osceola county.




