BLUEGILL LAKES ARE NOT BEING FISHED ENOUGH

Southern Michigan anglers are not now fishing the state's 'bluegill lakes' hard enough to crop the maximum yield of these waters. O. H. Clark, fisheries research man of the conservation department, concludes from a three-year study still in progress, of five of these lakes.

Clark favors more fishing rather than less of it to improve the yield of southern bluegill waters, and estimates that the yield might be increased as much as 15 per cent if all legal size fish were cropped annually.

The five lakes for which intensive creel census records have been kept since the winter of 1937-38 are Bear lake in Hillsdale county, Craig lake in Branch county, Christiana lake in Cass county, Paw Paw lake in Berrien county, and Stearns bayou in Ottawa county.

The 85,000 records of fishing on these lakes, which cover 30 to 50 per cent of the fishing done, show that 63,225 fishermen-days produced catches of 241,233 legal fish.

Winter fishermen were only half as numerous as summer fishermen, yet they took just as many fish, 21,869 winter fishermen-days yielding 121,565 fish, where 41,356 summer fishermen-days produced 120,273 fish.

Fish populations of Craig and Bear lake were determined by netting, tagging and recovery of the tagged fish by netting again and again. It was found that winter anglers were catching only 10 per cent of the total poundage available in Craig lake, and only two per cent of the total poundage available in Bear lake.

Reduction of the daily limit from 25 to 15 bluegill per angler would use the total winter catch only 10 per cent and reduce the total summer catch only five per cent on these lakes, Clark found from an analysis of the creel census cards.

SECLUDED CAMP SITES SELECTED BY FOREST DEPT.

Outfitting of secluded state forest camp grounds for the 1941 season has already begun, and all 40 principal sites, accommodating two to 35 parties each, will be ready for use by June 1, the conservation department's forestry division announced this week.

Scattered through 13 state forests, the sites are supplied with all the essentials for comfortable camping—fireplace, well, tables and benches and sanitary facilities. They appeal particularly to tourists wishing to get into wilderness areas away from main highways.

Visitors registers show some tourists return to the same camping spot year after year. Many camp sites have well developed trails and most of them are located along streams or on lake shores where either swimming or fishing is available. In Houghton Lake state forest, camps for canoeists on the upper Muskegon river.

More than 33,000 signed guests registers in state forest camp grounds last season, and actual test counts have shown that less than half the site users sign. Besides the 40 principal campgrounds there are many small camping sites and picnic spots in state forests equipped with tables and stoves.
