Ninth Grade: English I, Algebra I, General Math, Latin I, Citizenship, Health, Business Training, Mechanical Drawing, Homemaking I, Band and Glee Club.

Tenth Grade: English II, Plans Geometry, Biology, Latin II, World History, Business English and Economic Geography (each 1/2 year), Shop I, Homemaking II, Band and Glee Club.

Eleventh Grade: English III, Algebra II, Chemistry, American History, Bookkeeping I, Shop and I, Typing I, Retail Selling, Shop II, Band and Glee Club.

Twelfth Grade: English IV, Journalism, Public Speaking, Dramatics, Solid Geometry, Trigonometry, Physics, American Government, Economics, Social Problems, Cooperative work in office practice and salesmanship by permission, Homemaking III, Band and Glee Club.

Students will also be given an outline, advising subjects necessary and making recommendations for College Preparatory, Industrial Arts, Homemaking and Commercial courses.
