

4-H TEAM TO NATIONAL DAIRY SHOW

Coached by Mrs. Frank Achenbach, their club leader, the team took first place over four rivals for the trip, in the annual competition at the recent Michigan State Fair, Detroit. As state winners, they receive all-expense trips to Memphis through the Kraft Cheese Company, which also provides \$2800 in college scholarships for the eight highest scoring teams in the finals there.

Women Told of Southern School

Women of the Farmington Methodist Church heard about the Martha Berry School in Georgia when they met at the church Wednesday afternoon. The Rev. and Mrs. Howard Busching told about their trip to the school.

"The most remarkable school in America," is what the U. S. Department of Education has said about the Berry School which is conducted for poor mountain white girls and boys only. It has an enrollment of 1200 with 5000 on the waiting list. It is an accredited high school and college with the highest standards. Its campus is 15 miles long and 12 miles wide and has over 100 buildings. None of the students pay tuition. Each attends four days a week and works two. The school was founded by Miss Berry in 1901 from a Sunday School class meeting in a log cabin. Her father owned the land where the school now stands, and she resides across the road from the school in the old family homestead. All her personal fortune has gone into the school which has brought its founder the distinction of being named one of the 50 greatest women in the United States.
