



#### Game Law Awaits Legislative Action



Effective date of the new law is dependent upon adjournment or special action of the Legislature. Under the present law deer and bear may be kept without a permit for 60 days after the close of the funting season, though other game may not be kept longer than 10 days after the season's end. The same measure that provides for storage permits also extends to 30 days the period for keeping game other than deer or bear without permit, but this provision is not likely to be effective soon enough to benefit small game hunters this season. Permits obtainable from conservations.

hunters this season.

Fermits obtainable from conservation officers when the new system becomes effective will allow the holding of game in a freezer locker or other cold storage place named in the permit for an additional six months or less. Permits

will be issued to holders of curren hunting licenses and to persons who can establish proof of legal cossession of game given them as a gift. They also will be issued only for storage of game in those places where regular inspection by conservation officers or state polic is allowed.
